The workshop on February 15, 2023 tested the educational materials developed in the project "RESIST - For Human Rights. Learning materials on the resistance against National Socialism in Europe using the example of France and Germany 1933-1945 ". The test group were students of a bilingual 10th grade of Georg- von-Giesche School, aged 15-16. The five-hour test workshop took place at the German Resistance Memorial Center. First, the group's prior knowledge of the topic was			

clarified in a discussion based on historical photos. Then, in working groups, the young people worked on introductory texts and biographies of people from the resistance against National Socialism in Germany and France with the help of guiding questions. The small groups chose for themselves which materials they would like to work with in greater depth. They recorded their research results in wall papers and presented them in plenary. The biographies on resistance in Germany could be presented in the permanent exhibition of the memorial. Given the advanced time, it was only possible to briefly discuss similarities and differences in the resistance in Germany and France. A final method dealt with the significance that dealing with the resistance against National Socialism can have for the present. Moderation cards were used to work on various dimensions that - despite all the differences in the conditions for action in dictatorship and democracy - were relevant for people in the resistance and that are also important for us today for a good coexistence: Taking responsibility, informing oneself, being courageous, criticizing, standing up for others, fighting against discrimination, freedom....

Finally, the young people and teachers evaluated the work with the educational materials and the seminar day on detailed questionnaires. The workshop and the materials were evaluated very positively. The class worked exceptionally well and actively on the topic throughout the seminar. The seminar was held mainly in German, but also partly in French

The workshop on March 09, 2023 tested the educational materials developed in the project "RESIST - For Human Rights. Learning materials on the resistance against National Socialism in Europe using the example of France and Germany 1933-1945 ". The test group were students of a 9th grade French High School in Berlin, aged 14-15. The five-hour test workshop took place at the German Resistance Memorial Center. First, the group's prior knowledge of the topic was clarified in a discussion based on historical photos. Then, in working groups, the young people worked on introductory texts and biographies of people from the resistance against National Socialism in Germany and France with the help of guiding questions. Finally, the young people and teachers evaluated the work with the educational materials and the seminar day on detailed questionnaires. The workshop and the materials were evaluated very positively. The class worked exceptionally well and actively on the topic throughout the seminar. The seminar was held mainly in German, but also partly in French.

In this three-day workshop in July 2023, the learning materials developed as part of the project "RESIST - For Human Rights" were tested. Videos on the topic of "Resistance to National Socialism in France and Germany 1933-1945" were filmed together with the young participants. The test group were pupils of a 9th grade class of the Georg-von-Giesche-School in Berlin Schöneberg. The young people were 14-15 years old and attended a bilingual class.

The first day (5h) took place at the German Resistance Memorial Center. First, the group's prior knowledge of the topic was clarified in a discussion based on historical photos. Then the young people worked in working groups with the help of guiding questions on introductory texts and biographies of people from the resistance against National Socialism in Germany and France. The small groups chose for themselves which materials they wanted to work with in greater depth. They recorded their research results on wall papers and presented them in plenary. The biographies on the resistance in Germany could be presented in the permanent exhibition of the memorial.

The second day (5h) took place at the Georg von Giesche School. In a first work unit, the young people dealt with the significance that the confrontation with the resistance against National Socialism can have for the present. With the help of moderation cards, various dimensions were worked out which - despite all the differences in the conditions for action in dictatorship and democracy - were relevant for the people in the resistance and which are also important for us today for a good living together. Here, there was also intensive discussion about standing up for human rights - in its historical and current relevance for a good coexistence.

In the second part of the day, the young people developed scripts for short videos in small groups. With these videos they remember the people in the resistance, to which they had worked in depth on the first day of the seminar.

The third day (5h) took place again at the German Resistance Memorial Center. Here the videos of the individual small groups were recorded. At the same time, the young people were offered in-depth information in the exhibition. There was also an exercise on similarities and differences in the resistance in France and in Germany.

Finally, the videos were viewed together.

At the end of the seminar, the young people and teachers evaluated the work with the educational materials and the entire video project using detailed questionnaires. The three- day seminar was evaluated very positively. The young people particularly liked the video work. The seminar was held mainly in German, but many videos were shot in German and French.
